In my own Words..... By David Glennister.

I started playing Short Mat Bowls back in April 1990 at a small club in Devon called Abbotskerswell. This was just a way of getting my father interested in something after his Cancer operation. The general idea was for him to continue and for me to carry on playing Ten Pin Bowls. Things didn't work out as planned, in our first season at Abbotskerswell we won the Club Pairs and I was hooked, Ten Bin Bowls was no more.

League Titles and Club trophies followed, before I got a lucky break (Literally) to play for the County team. I went to the Devon Trials but failed to make the cut in only my second season, but fate was to see that I got a place after all. One of my club members who had secured a county place, went on a cruise and broke his Ankle on the gang plank on returning, a replacement was needed and that was me. After getting in the team I never looked back and have been a County team player for nearly every year since then.

More open competitions have followed along with County titles and two years playing in the England squad with the highlight being my Silver Medal at the British Isles. Another highlight was being runner up in the National Triples. A move to Dorset and a retirement from the game for a couple of years only saw me want to come back and win more, which I have and the the last two years have seen me take on the role of "A" team manager for Dorset which has given me a new lease of life in the sport again at the age of 57.

I have mellowed a bit over the years and winning isn't as important as it once was, don't get me wrong I still want to win National Titles and the ICC competitions, but now I also enjoy competing with my Fiancée and we have already one several competitions locally together.

So it has come full circle I started playing with my dad and now play with my Fiancée, I get just as much enjoyment these days from being club Captain at Wool SMBC and Dorset "A" Team Manager as I do from playing.

So we come to the actual question, What does Short Mat mean to me ?, well I guess the short answer is everything, the long answer is 28 years of Fantastic sport at all levels, club to Country. Meeting so many people I can now call friends from across the UK and Europe. Short Mat Bowls is a sport that is for All Ages, All Sexes and all Abilities.

My only regret is that I didn't find the sport Earlier.
